American Curl



General Standard

The distinctive feature of the American Curl is their attractive, uniquely curled-back ears. Curls are elegant, well balanced, moderately muscled, slender rather than massive in build. Males are larger than females. Proper proportion and balance are more important than size. Allowance is to be made for normal male characteristics. They are alert, active, with gentle, even dispositions.

Head	Shape: modified wedge without flat planes, moderately longer than wide, smooth transitions.
	Profile: nose moderate in length and straight, slight rise from bottom of eyes to
	forehead, gentle curve to top of head, flowing into neck, without a break. Size:
	medium in proportion to body.
	Muzzle: rounded with gentle transition, no pronounced whisker break. Chin firm, in
	line with nose and upper lip.
Forc	Degree: minimum 90 degree arc of curl, not to exceed 180 degrees. Firm cartilage
Ears	from ear base to at least 1/3 of height.
	Shape: wide at base and open, curving back in smooth arc when viewed from front
	and rear. Tips rounded and flexible.
	Size: moderately large.
	Placement: erect, set equally on top and side of head.
	Furnishings: desirable.
	Note 1: when Curls are alert with ears swiveled toward front, lines following curve
	of ear through tips should point to center of base of skull. (Lines following curve of
	ear through tips beyond 90 and up to 180 degrees may intersect at a point farther
	up on skull, but not beyond top of skull.
	Note 2: Vertical and horizontal crimp are two opposite and undesirable extremes
	affecting the base of the curled ear. The former causing the base to appear too
	narrow, the latter causing the base to appear too wide.
Eyes	Shape: walnut, oval on top and round on bottom.
_,	Placement: set on slight angle between base of ear and tip of nose one eye width
	apart. Size: moderately large.
	Colour: clear, brilliant, no relation to coat color except blue eyes required in
	colourpoint class.
Nose	Moderate in length and straight, slight rise from bottom of eyes to forehead, gentle
	curve to top of head, flowing into neck, without a break.
Chin	Firm, in line with nose and upper lip.
Neck	Medium.
Body	Torso is a semi-foreign rectangle, length one and one half times height at shoulder,
-	medium depth of chest and flank. Size is intermediate, with allowances for larger
	males. Musculature is to be moderate in strength and tone and flexible.
Legs	Length medium in proportion to body, set straight when viewed from front or rear.
-	Medium boning, neither fine nor heavy.
Paws	Medium and rounded.
Tail	Flexible, wide at base, tapering; equal to body length.

Faults & Penalties

Refer to general list of faults for all breeds plus: **Penalise:**

- Low set ears.
- Abrupt change of direction without smooth curve.
- Pinch, horizontal or vertical crimp to the ears.
- Interior surface which appears corrugated.
- Tubular or cobby body.
- Excessive size.
- Deep nose break.
- L/H: Heavy undercoat, heavy ruff, coarse or cottony texture.
- S/H: Heavy undercoat coarse or texture, dense or plush coats.

Withhold:

- Extreme curl in an adult cat where the tip of the ear touches the back of the head or the ear itself.
- Ear tips that are not flexible.
- Ears in which the lower portion of the ear is abnormally flattened, has compressed ridges of cartilage and does not have a normal, visible ear cavity.
- Lack of firm cartilage in base of ear.
- Tail faults.

Coat & Colour

Length & Texture	 LONGHAIR: Texture: fine, silky, laying flat. undercoat: minimal. Coat length: semi-long. Tail coat: full and plumed. SHORTHAIR: Texture: soft, silky, laying flat, resilient without a plush dense feel. undercoat:
	minimal. Coat length: short. Tail coat: same length as body coat.
Coat & Pattern	Any recognised coat colour or recognised combination of coat colour except cinnamon, fawn, caramel and apricot. Any recognised pattern. The colour and pattern should be clear and distinct. In the case of the classic, mackerel and spotted patterns, tabbies should be well marked and even. NOTE: Buttons and lockets are allowable on any colour and/or pattern.
Eye Colour	Shades of green, green-gold, gold, orange or copper. Blue-eyes or odd-eyes are also allowed for white or bi-colour (including vans) patterned cats and blue eyes required for pointed cats.
Nose Leather /	Plain or mottled, to tone with the coat colour in the nose area.
