# **Tonkinese**



## **General Standard**

The Tonkinese cat was originally the result of a Siamese to Burmese mating. The ideal Tonkinese is intermediate in type, being neither cobby nor svelte. Medium sized, it is an alert active cat with good muscular development, heavier than it looks. Males are generally larger than females.

Head	Modified slightly rounded wedge, somewhat longer than it is wide, with high gently planed cheekbones. The muzzle is blunt, as long as it is wide. There is a slight whisker break, gently curved, following the line of the wedge. The profile also shows a gentle contour, from a strong chin to a straight nose with a slight dip below eye level, flowing into a convex curve to the forehead.
Ears	Alert, medium in size. Oval tips, broad at the base. Ears set as much on the sides as the top.
Eyes	Alert, medium in size. Oval tips, broad at the base. Ears set as much on the sides as the top.
Nose	Moderate and straight. In profile, it has a gentle curve.
Cheeks	High, gently planed cheekbones.
Jaws	Rounded, not pointed, pinched or square.
Chin	Firm. In profile, of good depth and in a vertical line with the tip of the nose.
Neck	Medium.
Body	Medium in length, demonstrating well developed muscular strength without coarseness.  The Tonkinese conformation strikes a midpoint between the extremes of the long, svelte body types and the cobby, compact body types. Balance and proportion are more important than size alone. The abdomen should be taut, well muscled and firm.
Legs	Fairly slim, proportionate in length and bone to the body. Hind legs slightly longer than the front.
Paws	Neat and oval.
Tail	Proportionate in length to body. Gently tapering.

## **Faults & Penalties**

Refer to general list of faults for all breeds plus:

## Penalise:

- Extreme ranginess or cobbiness. •
- Definite nose break.
- Round eyes.

## Withhold:

- Yellow eyes.
- Lack of contrast of colour.
- White locket or button.
- Palpable tail faults.

## Coat

Coat	Medium short in length, close lying, fine, soft and silky, with a lustrous sheen.

## Colour

Mink	The mature specimen should be a rich, even, unmarked colour, shading almost imperceptibly to a slightly lighter hue on the under parts. Allowance to be made for lighter body colour in younger cats. With the dilute colours in particular, development of full body colour may take up to 16 months. Cats do darken with age, but there must be a distinct contrast between body colour and points.
Point colour	Mask, ears, feet and tail all densely marked, but merging gently into body colour. Except in kittens, mask and ears should be connected by tracings.
Eye Colour	Aqua. A definite characteristic of the Tonkinese breed. Depth, clarity and brilliance of colour preferred.

Solid	Body colour in solid coloured Tonkinese may be a slightly lighter shade of the point colour, with very little contrast with points. There will be more contrast between points and body colour for the Champagne and Platinum solid than for the Natural and Blue Solids
Eye Colour	Green to gold.

Pointed	Body colour of pointed Tonkinese should be off-white, any shading relevant to the point colour; overall body colour should be in marked contrast to the points.
Eye Colour	Blue.

## **Mink Pattern**

## **Brown (Natural) Mink**

Coat Colour	Medium brown. Ruddy highlights acceptable.
Points	Dark brown.
Nose Leather	Dark brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Medium to dark brown (may have a rosy undertone).

#### **Blue Mink**

Coat Colour	Soft blue grey with warm overtones.
Points	Slate blue, distinctly darker than body colour.
Nose Leather	Blue grey (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Blue grey (may have a rosy undertone).

### **Chocolate (Champagne) Mink**

Coat Colour	Buff cream to beige. Reddish highlights acceptable.
Points	Medium brown.
Nose Leather	Pinkish brown (corresponding to intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Pinkish brown.

## Lilac (Platinum) Mink

Coat Colour	Pale silvery grey with warm overtones. Not white or cream.
Points	Frosty grey, distinctly darker than the body colour.
Nose Leather	Lavender pink to lavender grey.
Paw Pads	Lavender pink.

## **Red Mink**

Coat Colour	Cream to pale apricot; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring.
Points	Rich apricot, with brighter tones preferred; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring on the mask, legs and tail.
Nose Leather	Pink.
Paw Pads	Pink.
Remarks	Freckles may appear on the nose leather, eye rims, paw pads and ears and should not be penalised.

## **Cream Mink**

Coat Colour	Pale, cool-toned cream; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring.
Points	Rich cream, with paler shades preferred; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring on mask, legs and tail.
Nose Leather	Pink.
Paw Pads	Pink.
Remarks	Freckles may appear on the nose leather, eye rims, paw pads and ears and should not be penalised.

### **Tortie Mink Pattern**

The base colour should be Brown (Natural), Blue, Chocolate (Champagne), Lilac (Platinum), which is wellbroken and free from tabby markings intermingled with varying shades of red or cream. Any large areas of red or cream may show some tabby markings. The distribution of colour is random and immaterial, though a blaze on the nose or solid colour on any of the legs or tail are acceptable. Ears are mottled. The base colour on the points should be darker than the base colour on the body, although the legs and feet may be paler than the other points.

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## **Brown (Natural) Tortie Mink**

Coat Colour	Medium brown, well-broken with varying shades of red.
Points	Dark brown, intermingled with varying shades of red.
Nose Leather	Dark brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Medium to dark brown (may have a rosy undertone), pink or both.

## **Blue Tortie Mink**

Coat Colour	Soft blue-grey with warm undertones, well broken with varying shades of cream.
Points	Slate blue, distinctly darker than body colour with varying shades of cream.
Nose Leather	Blue-grey (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Blue-grey (may have a rosy undertone), pink or both.

## **Chocolate (Champagne) Tortie Mink**

Coat Colour	Buff-cream to beige (reddish highlights acceptable), well-broken with varying shades of red and/or cream.
Points	Medium-brown with varying shades of red and/or cream.
Nose Leather	Pinkish-brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Pinkish-brown, pink or both.

## Lilac (Platinum) Tortie Mink

Coat Colour	Pale silvery-grey with warm overtones (not white), well-broken with varying shades of cream.
Points	Frosty grey, distinctly darker than the body colour with varying shades of cream.
Nose Leather	Lavender pink to lavender grey, pink or both.
Paw Pads	Lavender pink, pink or both.

## **Solid Pattern**

## **Brown Solid**

Coat Colour	Sable brown.
Points	Dark brown.
Nose Leather	Dark brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Medium to dark brown (may have a rosy undertone).

## **Blue Solid**

Coat Colour	Slate blue with warm overtones.
Points	Slate blue.
Nose Leather	Blue-grey (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Blue-grey (may have a rosy undertone).

## **Chocolate Solid**

Coat Colour	Milk chocolate.
Points	Warm milk chocolate.
Nose Leather	Cinnamon brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Cinnamon-pink to cinnamon-brown.

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### **Lilac Solid**

Coat Colour	Dove grey.
Points	Frosty grey
Nose Leather	Lavender-pink to lavender-grey.

#### **Red Solid**

Coat Colour	Warm apricot, paler than the points; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring.
Points	Rich apricot, with brighter tones preferred; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring on the mask, legs and tail.
Nose Leather	Pink.
Paw Pads	Pink.
Remarks	Freckles may appear on the nose leather, eye rims, paw pads and ears and should not be penalised.

#### **Cream Solid**

Coat Colour	Warm, cool-toned cream; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring.
Points	Rich cream, with paler shades preferred; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring on mask, legs and tail.
Nose Leather	Pink.
Paw Pads	Pink.
Remarks	Freckles may appear on the nose leather, eye rims, paw pads and ears and should not be penalised.

## **Tortie Solid Pattern**

The base colour should be Brown (Natural), Blue, Chocolate (Champagne), Lilac (Platinum), which is wellbroken and free from tabby markings interminaled with varying shades of red or cream. Any large areas of red or cream may show some tabby markings. The distribution of colour on the points is random and immaterial, though a blaze up the nose or solid colour on any of the legs or tail are acceptable. Ears are mottled. The colour on the points and body should match in tone but may not merge evenly.

## **Brown (Natural) Tortie Solid**

Coat Colour	Medium brown, well-broken with varying shades of red.
Points	Dark brown, intermingled with varying shades of red.
Nose Leather	Dark brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Medium to dark brown (may have a rosy undertone), pink or both.

## **Blue Tortie Solid**

Coat Colour	Slate blue with warm overtones, well-broken, intermingled with varying shades of
	cream.
Points	Slate blue, distinctly darker than body colour with varying shades of cream.
Nose Leather	Blue-grey (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Blue-grey (may have a rosy undertone), pink or both.

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## **Chocolate (Champagne) Tortie Solid**

Coat Colour	Milk chocolate, well-broken with varying shades of red.
Points	Warm milk chocolate with varying shades of red.
Nose Leather	Cinnamon brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Cinnamon-pink to cinnamon brown, pink or both.

## Lilac (Platinum) Tortie Mink

Coat Colour	Dove grey, well-broken with varying shades of cream.
Points	Frosty grey, distinctly darker than the body colour with varying shades of cream.
Nose Leather	Lavender pink to lavender grey, pink or both.
Paw Pads	Lavender pink, pink or both.

## **Pointed Pattern**

## **Seal Point**

Coat Colour	Fawn to cream.
Points	Dark brown.
Nose Leather	Dark brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Medium to dark brown (may have a rosy undertone.)

## **Blue Point**

<b>Coat Colour</b>	Slate blue with warm overtones.
Points	Slate blue.
Nose Leather	Blue-grey (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Blue-grey (may have a rosy undertone).

## **Chocolate Point**

Coat Colour	Ivory with shading in same colour as points.
Points	Milk chocolate.
Nose Leather	Cinnamon brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Cinnamon-pink to cinnamon-brown.

## **Lilac Point**

Coat Colour	Pearly white.
Points	Frosty grey
Nose Leather	Lavender-pink to lavender-grey. (Corresponding to the intensity of the point colour).
Paw Pads	Lavender-pink.

## **Red Point**

Coat Colour	Milky-white; shading, if any, is to tone with the points, but of a lighter tone.
Points	Rich apricot, with brighter tones preferred; whilst it is not desirable, allowances should be made for slight barring on the mask, legs and tail.
Nose Leather	Pink.
Paw Pads	Pink.

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#### **Cream Point**

<b>Coat Colour</b>	Ivory: shading, if any, is to tone with the points, but of a lighter shade.
Points	Rich cream with paler shades preferred; whilst it is not desirable allowances should
	be made for slight barring on the mask, legs and tail.
Nose Leather	Pink.
Paw Pads	Pink.
Remarks	Freckles may appear on the nose leather, eye rims, paw pads and ears and should
	not be penalised.

## **Tortie Point**

Colour is restricted to the points and comes in Brown (Natural), Blue, Chocolate (Champagne), Lilac (Platinum), which is well broken and free from tabby markings intermingled with varying shades of red or cream. Any large areas of red or cream may show some tabby markings. The distribution of colour on the points is random and immaterial, though a blaze up the nose or solid colour on any of the legs or tail are acceptable. Ears are mottled.

### **Brown (Natural) Tortie Point**

Coat Colour	Fawn to cream.
Points	Dark brown, with varying shades of red on points.
Nose Leather	Dark brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Medium to dark brown (may have a rosy undertone).

### **Blue Tortie Point**

Coat Colour	Off-white with warm grey shading.
Points	Slate blue, distinctly darker than body co.lour with varying shades of cream on points.
Nose Leather	Blue-grey (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Blue-grey (may have a rosy undertone), pink or both.

### **Chocolate (Champagne) Tortie Point**

Coat Colour	Ivory with shading in same colour as points.
Points	Milk chocolate with varying shades of red on points.
Nose Leather	Pinkish-brown (corresponding to the intensity of the point colour), pink or both.
Paw Pads	Pinkish-brown, pink or both.

### Lilac (Platinum) Tortie Point

<b>Coat Colour</b>	Pearly-white.
Points	Frosty grey, distinctly darker than the body colour with varying shades of cream on points.
Nose Leather	Lavender pink to lavender grey, pink or both.
Paw Pads	Lavender pink, pink or both.

## **Breeding Notes**

### **Allowable Outcross**

European Burmese and Siamese in the four basic colours plus red, cream and tortie.

## Notes

- AOC Tonkinese of good type may be registered as "for breeding."
- Not permitted to be mated to bi-colour Siamese.
